Weekly Updates:

- The NCC Board of Trustees met on Monday, January 21, at 4:30 p.m. The following action items were approved: Consultant Service for Campaign Feasibility Study (Josh Faber with Renaissance Group from Des Moines), Future Ready Iowa High Demand Jobs, Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of General Obligation School Bonds (\$6.6 million of the \$14.185 million) and Levying a Tax for the Payment, Set Bid Letting and Public Hearing Dates Bldg. C Welding Renovation Project. Bids for the Welding Renovation will be received Monday, February 25, and acted upon that evening at the Board of Trustees' meeting.
- The NCC Board of Trustees and the Foundation Board held their annual joint meeting on Monday evening, January 21, in the NCC Cafeteria beginning at 6 p.m. Highlights of the meeting included:
 - honoring five Foundation Board members who are leaving the board (David Vander Werff, Tom Vinson, Kennis Peters, Dr. Heather Einck and Josh Feucht for a combined 28 years of serving the Foundation Board);
 - welcoming four new board members (Lyle Korver of Orange City, Richard Heidloff of George, Andy Jacobs of Primghar, and Brad Lupkes of Rock Rapids);
 - listening to a presentation from Williams & Company about the College and Foundation audit (all looks good!); and

- learning about the current status of the Foundation investments from Security National Bank (also a good report).
- NCC has been selected as a top automotive school according to *Trade School Future*. The organization looks at five different criteria: average cost of tuition, typical debt-load of graduates, average early career salary, average mid-career salary, and graduation rate. Based on that, ten top schools in the nation were designated and NCC ranked #10! Congratulations!
- Ty Fude (Associate of Arts), Maria Olvera-Flores (Administrative Office Assistant), and Anna Schmidt (Nursing) represented Northwest Iowa Community College on Wednesday and Thursday, January 23-24, at the **31st IACCT Student Legislative Seminar** held in Des Moines. The event included presentations on how to effectively advocate for Community Colleges and building working relationships with legislators. Thursday morning was spent at the State Capital and included a one-hour dialogue with our area legislators on topics that were specific to NCC. The students also toured the capitol. Joining the students for the two-day event were Mark Brown, Larry Hoekstra, and Alethea Stubbe. *(See photos in attachment.)*
- Alethea Stubbe attended the monthly lowa Association of Community College Presidents' (IACCP) meeting in Des Moines on Thursday, January 24. Collaboration with ISU Extension, Entrepreneurial Education and an Iowa Center of Practice at NIACC, Reducing Book Costs, Department of Education reports, Future Ready Iowa and other legislative topics filled the agenda.
- With instructor Robert Hoting, another successful "Fun Welding Art" class was held in the welding shop on Tuesday and Thursday nights, January 22 and 24. Five women and three men participated in picking a project or two, making the parts, and welding the parts together while learning a little about how welding works. NCC's very own Holly DeGrote and Paula Meyer were part of the class and created a couple very nice pieces of backyard lawn art. Darin and Dante Johnson were a father/son duo that just received a welder for Christmas, so this was a great learning experience for making their own projects at home.
