Weekly Updates:

- On Friday, January 25, Norma attended the lowa Latino Day on the Hill. The event was organized by the lowa Commission of Latino Affairs which is under the lowa Department of Human Rights. The goal was to learn about the 2018 lowa Commission of Latino Affairs policy recommendations as well as hear from lowa Legislators, lowa Latinx youth, elected officials, and nonprofit organizations. The legislative process, advocacy opportunities, why Latinos should run for office, and the barriers to engaging the Latinx community in the political processes were topics discussed during the session.

- Leadership from Village Northwest Unlimited (VNU) and NCC met on Tuesday, January 29, to discuss the status of the training for High-Performing Autistic students in NCC's proposed Manufacturing Operator Certificate program. VNU has hired a new leader for their Autism program, but since the new hire will need to acclimate herself first to VNU's existing programming, and since NCC could use the time to gain program approval from the IA DE, finalize fee structuring and budgetary considerations, and then complete financial aid approvals, we will not be offering the VNU-partnered training until summer / fall 2020.
- On Friday, February 1, an NCC Super Bowl Tailgate Party was held with lots of snacks and socialization taking place in the College Store, Student Services, Bldg C, and Bldg D. "Touchdown" cards were given to each person to "score" their chance at a prize.
