The peer review team drafts its report in the next four to six weeks following June 10. Then NCC will review the report and the team's recommendations for errors of fact before the peer review team submits its final report to HLC. After

that the report and institutional response are sent to the HLC Institutional Actions Council (IAC) for review and action. The entire review could take around three months.
