- This week, Allie Mouw and Kristi Heisinger set up 17 worksite tours (Coilcraft, LINK Manufacturing, Interstates, Interfab, Post, Ironwood 53, Siouxland Fabricating, Siouxland Machine, Valley Machining Company, Sudenga, LVO, DEMCO, Rosenboom, Rome, Maintainer) with 5 different area high schools: West Sioux, Rock Valley, Central Lyon, West Lyon, and Boyden Hull. These tours are to educate area high school students about the various careers that are in manufacturing such as accounting, human resources, management, machinists, welders, fabricators, engineers, etc. The experience has opened the eyes to many individuals that have driven by these companies daily and never knew what the buildings held within.

This coming week, Allie and Kristi will be speaking at the **Future Ready lowa Summit** in Orange City on Tuesday, October 29. These summits are held all across lowa for educators, business and industry and economic development to help prepare the community for the future. Following this event, NCC will be hosting the **Breaking Down the Barriers Workshop** to promote women in manufacturing. We have a career panel with 14 women working in manufacturing in various positions: president, accounting supervisors, welders, product supervisors, etc. **Manufacturing tours** will continue next week Wednesday and Friday with **8 more tours** (Interfab, Interstates, LINK Manufacturing, AIM Aerospace, K2W, Siouxland Fabricating, Siouxland Machine and Double HH) and two high schools, MOC-FV and Netherlands Reformed. Some feedback from this week was how eye-opening it was for instructors and students to see the difference of real-life manufacturing versus how they envisioned it. 


